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**MOSES BROWN SCHOOL STUDENT-ATHLETE NAMED
GATORADE® RHODE ISLAND GIRLS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

CHICAGO (March 13, 2017) — In its 32nd year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, today announced Oluchi Ezemma of Moses Brown School as its 2016-17 Gatorade Rhode Island Girls Basketball Player of the Year. Ezemma is the first Gatorade Rhode Island Girls Basketball Player of the Year to be chosen from Moses Brown School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the court, distinguishes Ezemma as Rhode Island's best high school girls basketball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Girls Basketball Player of the Year award announced in March, Ezemma joins an elite alumni association of past state girls basketball award-winners, including Maya Moore (2005-06, Collins Hill HS, Ga.), Rashanda McCants (2004-05, Asheville HS, N.C.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Diana Taurasi (1998-99 & 1999-00, Don Antonio Lugo HS, Calif.), Shyra Ely (1999-00, Ben Davis HS, Ind.) and Lisa Leslie (1988-89, Morningside HS, Calif.).

The 5-foot-11 junior forward and center had led the Quakers to a 16-5 record and a berth in the Open State Tournament at the time of her selection. Ezemma averaged 18.6 points and 16.0 rebounds through 21 games with 19 double-doubles, including three straight games with at least 20 points and 20 rebounds. The highest vote-getter on the Rhode Island Basketball Coaches Association's All-State team, she entered the state tournament with 1,103 points and 974 rebounds in her prep basketball career.

A leader of the Black Affinity Group at Moses Brown, Ezemma has volunteered locally as part of community beautification projects and at a food bank and homeless shelter. "Oluchi creates matchup nightmares for every opposing team and can take over a game all by herself," said George Coderre, head coach of Cumberland High. "She makes all of her teammates considerably more effective."

Ezemma has maintained a weighted 3.88 GPA in the classroom and represents one of the state's top academic candidates in meeting the Gatorade award's broad criteria. She will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The [Gatorade Player of the Year](#) program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade Player of the Year Selection Committee, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Ezemma joins recent Gatorade Rhode Island Girls Basketball Players of the Year Celia Tomlinson (2015-16, South Kingstown High School), Sarah Middleton (2014-15, Barrington High School), Taylor Buckley (2013-14 & 2012-13, North Kingstown High School), Kailey Fugere (2011-12, Woonsocket High School), Kelly Mannix (2010-11, Barrington High School), Allie Jones (2009-10, South Kingstown High School), Torey Jones (2008-09, La Salle Academy), Brittany Wilson (2007-08, St. Mary Academy-Bay View), and Meredith Ward (2006-07, Westerly High School) among the state's list of former award winners.

As a Gatorade Player of the Year, Oluchi will be able to select a national or local youth sports organization to receive a grant as part of the Gatorade Play It Forward program. Every Gatorade Player of the Year state winner receives a \$1,000 grant to donate and will have the opportunity to enter for an additional \$10,000 spotlight grant by writing a brief essay explaining why their selected organization deserves additional support. 12 spotlight grants - one for each sport - will be announced throughout the year.
